Gen 1:20	<p>And God said, "Let the waters swarm with swarms of <b>living</b> creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the heavens."</p>
Gen 1:21	<p>So God created • the great sea creatures* and • every <b>living</b> creature that moves, with which the waters swarm, according to* their kinds, and • every winged bird according to* its kind. And God saw that it was good.</p>
Gen 1:24	<p>And God said, "Let* the earth bring forth* <b>living</b> creatures according to* their kinds— livestock and creeping things* and beasts of the earth according to* their kinds." And it was so.</p>
Gen 1:30	<p>And to every beast of the earth and to every bird of the heavens and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the <b>breath</b> of life, I have given • every green plant for food." And it was so.</p>
Gen 2:7	<p>then the Lord God formed • the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a <b>living creature</b>.</p>

- Gen 9:4 But you shall not eat flesh with its **life**, that is, its blood.
- Gen 9:5 And • for your **lifeblood** I will require a reckoning: from • every beast I will require\* it and from • man. From • his fellow man I will require a reckoning • for the **life** of • man.
- Gen 9:10 and with every • living **creature** that is with you, • the birds, • the livestock, and • every beast of the earth with you, as many as\* came out of the ark; it is for every beast of the earth.
- Gen 9:12 And God said, “This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and • you and • every living **creature** that is with you, for all future generations:
- Gen 9:15 • I will remember • my covenant that is between me and • you and • every living **creature** of all flesh. And the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh.
- Gen 9:16 When the bow is in the clouds, • I will see it • and remember the everlasting covenant between God and • every **living** creature of all flesh that is on the earth.”
- Gen 12:5 And Abram took • Sarai his wife, and • Lot his brother’s son, and • all their possessions that they had gathered, and • the **people** that they had acquired in Haran, and they set out to go to the land of Canaan. When they came to the land of Canaan,
- Gen 12:13 Say • you are my sister, that it may go well with me because of you, and that my **life** may be spared\* for\* your sake.”\*
- Gen 14:21 And the king of Sodom said to Abram, “Give • me the **persons**, but take the goods for yourself.”
- Gen 17:14 • Any uncircumcised male who is not circumcised • in the flesh of\* his foreskin\* • shall be cut off • from his people; he has broken • my covenant.”
- Gen 19:17 And • as they brought • them out, • one said, “Escape for your **life**. Do not look back or • stop anywhere in • the valley. Escape to the hills, lest you be swept away.”
- Gen 19:19 Behold, • your servant has found favor in your sight, and you have shown • me great kindness • • in saving • my **life**. But I cannot escape to the hills, lest the disaster overtake me and I die.
- Gen 19:20 Behold, • • this • city is near enough to flee • to, and it is a little one. Let me escape • there— is it not a little one ?— and my **life** will be saved!” •
- Gen 23:8 And he said to them, “ If you **are willing**\* that I should bury\* my • dead out of my sight, hear me and entreat for me • Ephron the son of Zohar,

- Gen 27:4 and prepare for me delicious food, such as I love, and bring it to me so that I may eat, that my **soul** may bless\* you before I die.”
- Gen 27:19 • Jacob said to his father, “I am Esau your firstborn. I have done as you told • me; now sit up\* • and eat of my game, that your **soul** may bless\* me.”
- Gen 27:25 Then he said, “Bring it near to me, that I may eat of my son’s game • and • bless you.” So he brought it near to him, and he ate; and he brought • him wine, and he drank.
- Gen 27:31 • He also prepared delicious food and brought it to his father. And he said to his father, “Let my father arise and eat of his son’s game, that you may bless\* me.” •
- Gen 32:30 So Jacob called the name of the place Peniel, saying, “For I have seen God face to face, and yet my **life** has been delivered.”
- Gen 34:3 And his **soul** was drawn to Dinah the daughter of Jacob. • He loved • the young woman and spoke tenderly to her.\*
- Gen 34:8 But Hamor spoke with them, saying, “The **soul** of • my son Shechem longs for your daughter. Please give • her to him to be his wife.
- Gen 35:18 And • as her **soul** was departing (for she was dying), • she called his name Ben-oni; but his father called • him Benjamin.
- Gen 36:6 Then Esau took • his wives, • his sons, • his daughters, and • all the **members** of\* his household,\* • his livestock, • all his beasts, and • all his property that he had acquired in the land of Canaan. • He went into a land away from\* his brother Jacob.
- Gen 37:21 But when Reuben heard it, • he rescued him out of their hands, • saying, “Let us not take his **life**.”
- Gen 42:21 Then they said to one another,\* “In truth we are guilty concerning our brother, in that we saw the distress of\* his **soul**,\* when he begged • us and we did not listen. That is why\* • this • distress has come upon us.”
- Gen 44:30 “Now therefore, as soon as I come to your servant my father, and the boy • is not\* with us, then, as his **life** is bound up in • the boy’s **life**,
- Gen 46:15 These are the sons of Leah, whom she bore to Jacob in Paddan-aram, • together with his daughter Dinah; altogether • his sons and his daughters numbered thirty-three.
- Gen 46:18 These are the sons of Zilpah, whom Laban gave to Leah his daughter; and • these she bore to Jacob— sixteen **persons**.

- Gen 46:22 These are the sons of Rachel, who were born to Jacob— fourteen **persons** in all.
- Gen 46:25 These are the sons of Bilhah, whom Laban gave to Rachel his daughter, and • these she bore to Jacob— seven **persons** in all.
- Gen 46:26 All the **persons** belonging to Jacob who came into Egypt, who were his own descendants,\* not including\* Jacob's sons' wives, were sixty-six **persons** in all.
- Gen 46:27 And the sons of Joseph, who were born to him in Egypt, were two. • All the **persons** of the house of Jacob who came into Egypt were seventy.
- Gen 49:6 Let my **soul** come not into their council; O\* my glory,\* be not joined to their company. For in their anger they killed men, and in their willfulness they hamstrung oxen.
- Exod 1:5 • All the **descendants\*** of Jacob were seventy **persons**; • Joseph was already in Egypt.
- Exod 4:19 And the Lord said to Moses in Midian, "Go back to Egypt, for all the men who were seeking • your **life** are dead."
- Exod 12:4 And if the household is too\* small for\* a lamb, then he and his • nearest neighbor • • • shall take according to the number of **persons**; according to what each • can eat you shall make your count for the lamb.
- Exod 12:15 Seven days • you shall eat unleavened bread. On the • first day you shall remove leaven out of your houses, for if anyone eats what is leavened, from the • first day until the • seventh day, • • that • **person** shall be cut off from Israel.
- Exod 12:16 • On the • first day you shall hold a holy assembly, and on the • seventh day a holy assembly. • • • No work shall be done on those† days. But what • **everyone** needs to eat, that • alone may be prepared by you.
- Exod 12:19 For seven days no leaven is to be found in your houses. If anyone eats what is leavened, • • that • **person** will be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether • • he is a sojourner or • a native of the land.
- Exod 15:9 The enemy said, 'I will pursue, I will overtake, I will divide the spoil, my **desire** shall have its fill of them. I will draw my sword; my hand shall destroy them.'
- Exod 16:16 This is • • what the Lord has commanded: 'Gather of it, each one of you, as much as\* he can eat. You shall each take an omer, according to the number of the **persons** that each • • of you has in his tent.'
- Exod 21:23 But if there is harm, then you shall pay **life** for **life**,

Exod 21:30	■	If a ransom is imposed on him, then he shall give for the redemption of his <b>life</b> • whatever is imposed on him.
Exod 23:9	■	“• You shall not oppress a sojourner. • You know • the <b>heart</b> of a • sojourner, for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt.
Exod 30:12	■	“When you take the census* of the people of Israel, then each shall give a ransom for his <b>life</b> to the Lord when you number • them, that there be no plague among them when you number • them.
Exod 30:15	■	The rich shall not give more, and the poor shall not give less, than the half • shekel, when you • give • the Lord’s offering to make atonement for your <b>lives</b> .
Exod 30:16	■	• You shall take • the • atonement money from the people of Israel and shall give • it for the service of the tent of meeting, that it may bring • • the people of Israel to remembrance before the Lord, so as to make atonement for your <b>lives</b> .”
Exod 31:14	■	• You shall keep • the Sabbath, because it is holy for you. Everyone who profanes it shall be put to death. • Whoever does any work on it, • • that • <b>soul</b> shall be cut off* from among his people.
Lev 2:1	■	“• When <b>anyone</b> brings a grain offering as an offering to the Lord, his offering shall be of fine flour. • He shall pour oil on it and put frankincense on it
Lev 4:2	■	“Speak to the people of Israel, saying, If <b>anyone</b> sins unintentionally in any of the Lord’s commandments • about things not to be done, and does • any one of them,
Lev 4:27	■	“• If <b>anyone</b> of the • common people sins unintentionally in doing • any one of the things that by the Lord’s commandments ought not to be done, and realizes his guilt,
Lev 5:1	■	“• If <b>anyone</b> sins in that he hears a • public adjuration to testify, and though he is a witness, whether he has seen or come to know the matter, yet does not speak, • he shall bear his iniquity;
Lev 5:2	■	or if <b>anyone</b> touches • an unclean thing, whether • a carcass of an unclean wild animal or • a carcass of unclean livestock or • a carcass of unclean swarming things, and it is hidden from him and he has become unclean, and he realizes his guilt;
Lev 5:4	■	or if <b>anyone</b> utters with his lips a rash† oath to do evil or to do good, • any sort of rash† oath that • people • swear,† and it is hidden from him, when he comes to know it, and he realizes his guilt in any of these;

- Lev 5:15 "If **anyone** commits a breach of faith and sins unintentionally† in any of the holy things of the Lord, • he shall bring to the Lord as • his compensation, a ram without blemish\* out of the flock, • • valued in silver shekels, according to the shekel of the sanctuary, for a guilt offering.
- Lev 5:17 "• If **anyone** • sins, • doing • • any of the things that by the Lord's commandments ought not to be done, though he did not know it, then realizes his guilt, • he shall bear his iniquity.
- Lev 6:2 "If **anyone** sins and commits a breach of faith against the Lord by • deceiving • his neighbor in a matter of deposit or • security, or through robbery, or if he has oppressed • his neighbor
- Lev 7:18 • If any of the flesh of the sacrifice of his peace offering is eaten on the • third day, he who offers • it shall not be accepted, neither shall it be credited to him. It is tainted, and **he** who eats of it shall bear his iniquity.
- Lev 7:20 but the **person** who eats of the flesh of the sacrifice of the • Lord's peace offerings while an • uncleanness is on him, • that • **person** • shall be cut off from his people.
- Lev 7:21 And if **anyone** touches • an • unclean thing, whether • human uncleanness or • an unclean beast or • any unclean detestable creature, and then eats some flesh from the sacrifice of the • Lord's peace offerings, • • that • **person** shall be cut off from his people."
- Lev 7:25 For every person who eats of the fat of an animal of • which • a food offering may be made to the Lord • • • • shall be cut off from his people.
- Lev 7:27 **Whoever** • eats any blood, • • that • **person** shall be cut off from his people."
- Lev 11:10 But anything • in the seas or • the rivers that has not fins and scales, of • the swarming creatures in the waters and of • the • living **creatures** that are in the waters, is detestable to you.
- Lev 11:43 You shall not make • **yourselves** detestable with any • swarming thing that swarms, and you shall not defile yourselves with them, and become unclean through them.
- Lev 11:44 For I am the Lord your God. Consecrate yourselves therefore, and be holy, for I am holy. • You shall not defile • **yourselves** with any • swarming thing that crawls on the ground.
- Lev 11:46 This is the law about • beast and • bird and every • living **creature** that moves through the waters and • every **creature** that swarms on the ground,



- Lev 16:29 “And it shall be • a statute to you forever that in the • seventh month, on the tenth day of the month, you shall afflict • yourselves and shall do no • work, either the native or the stranger who sojourns among you.
- Lev 16:31 It is a Sabbath of solemn rest to you, and you shall afflict • yourselves; it is a statute forever.
- Lev 17:10 “• If any one\* of the house of Israel or of the strangers who sojourn among them • eats any blood, • I will set my face against that person who eats • • blood and will cut • him off from among his people.
- Lev 17:11 For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it for you on the altar to make atonement for your souls, for it is the blood that makes atonement by the life.
- Lev 17:12 Therefore I have said to the people of Israel, No person among you shall eat blood, neither shall any • stranger who sojourns among you eat blood.
- Lev 17:14 For the life of every creature is its blood: its blood is • its life. Therefore I have said to the people of Israel, You shall not eat the blood of any creature, for the life of every creature is its blood. Whoever eats it shall be cut off.
- Lev 17:15 And every person who eats what dies of itself or what is torn by beasts, whether he is • a • native or • a • sojourner, • shall wash his clothes and bathe himself in • water and be unclean until the evening; then he shall be clean.
- Lev 18:29 For everyone who does • any of • these • abominations, • the persons who do them shall be cut off from among their people.
- Lev 19:8 and everyone who eats it shall bear his iniquity, because he has profaned • what is holy to the Lord, and • that • person shall be cut off from his people.
- Lev 19:28 • You shall not make any cuts on your body for the dead or tattoo • • • yourselves: I am the Lord.
- Lev 20:6 “• If a • person • turns to • mediums and • • necromancers, whoring after them, • I will set • my face against • that • person and will cut • him off from among his people.
- Lev 20:25 You shall therefore separate • the • clean beast from the unclean, and • the • unclean bird from the clean. • You shall not make • yourselves detestable by • beast or by • bird or by anything with which the ground crawls, which I have set apart for you to hold unclean.

- Lev 21:1 And the Lord said to Moses, “Speak to the priests, the sons of Aaron, and say to them: No one shall make himself unclean for the **dead** among his people,
- Lev 21:11 • He shall not go in to any dead **bodies** nor make himself unclean, even for his father or for his mother.
- Lev 22:3 Say to them, ‘If any one of all your offspring throughout your generations • approaches • the holy things that the people of Israel dedicate to the Lord, • while he has an uncleanness,\* • • that • **person** shall be cut off from my presence: I am the Lord.
- Lev 22:4 None of the offspring of Aaron who • has a leprous disease or a discharge may eat of • the holy things until he is clean. • Whoever touches • anything that is unclean through contact with the **dead** or a man who has had\* an emission of semen, the **person** who touches • • such a thing • shall be unclean until the evening and shall not eat of the holy things unless he has bathed his body in • water.
- Lev 22:6 but if a priest buys • a slave as his property for money, the slave • may eat of it, and anyone born in his house • may eat of • his food.
- Lev 22:11 “• Now on the tenth day of • this • seventh • month is the Day of • Atonement. It shall be for you a time of holy convocation, and you shall afflict • **yourselves** and present • a food offering to the Lord.
- Lev 23:27 For **whoever** is not afflicted on • that very • day • shall be cut off from his people.
- Lev 23:29 And **whoever** does any work on • that very • day, • • that • **person** • I will destroy from among his people.
- Lev 23:30 It shall be to you a Sabbath of solemn rest, and you shall afflict • **yourselves**. On the ninth day of the month beginning at • evening, from evening to evening shall you keep your Sabbath.”
- Lev 23:32 “• • Whoever takes† • a human **life** shall surely be put to death.
- Lev 24:17 • Whoever takes an animal’s **life** shall make\* it good,\* **life** for **life**.
- Lev 24:18 • I will make my dwelling among you, and my **soul** shall not abhor • you.
- Lev 26:11 • if you spurn • my statutes, and if your **soul** abhors • my rules, so that you will not do • all my commandments, but • • break • my covenant,



- Lev 26:16 • then I will do this to you: • I will visit • you with panic, with • • wasting disease and • • fever that consume the eyes and make the heart ache. And you shall sow your seed in vain, for your enemies shall eat it.
- Lev 26:30 And I will destroy • your high places and cut down • your incense altars and cast • your dead bodies upon the dead bodies of your idols, and my soul will abhor • you.
- Lev 26:43 But the land shall be abandoned by them and enjoy • its Sabbaths while it lies desolate without them, and they shall make amends • for their iniquity, because • • • they spurned • my rules and their soul abhorred • my statutes.
- Lev 27:2 “Speak to the people of Israel and say to them, If anyone makes a special vow to the Lord involving the • valuation of persons,
- Num 5:2 “Command • the people of Israel that they put out\* of the camp everyone who is leprous or • has a discharge and everyone who is unclean through contact with the dead.
- Num 5:6 “Speak to the people of Israel, When a man or woman commits any of the sins that people commit\* by breaking faith with the Lord, and • that • person realizes his guilt,
- Num 6:6 “All the days that he separates himself to the Lord he shall not go near a dead body.
- Num 6:11 and the priest shall offer one for a sin offering and the other for a burnt offering, and make atonement for him, because he sinned by reason of the dead body. And he shall consecrate • his head • • that same • day
- Num 9:6 And there were certain men who were unclean through touching a dead body,\* so that they could not • keep the Passover on • that • day, and they came before Moses and • • Aaron on • that • day.
- Num 9:7 And • those • men said to him, “We are unclean through touching a dead body.\* Why are we kept from bringing • the Lord’s offering at its appointed time among the people of Israel?”
- Num 9:10 “Speak to the people of Israel, saying, If any one\* of you or of your descendants is unclean through touching a dead body,\* or is on a long journey, • he shall still keep the Passover to the Lord.
- Num 9:13 But if anyone† who is clean and is not on a journey • fails to keep the Passover, • • that • person shall be cut off from his people because he did not bring the Lord’s offering at its appointed time; • that • man shall bear his sin.

- Num 11:6 But now our strength is dried up, and there is nothing at all but† • this† manna to look at.”\*
- Num 15:27 “• If one person sins unintentionally, • he shall offer a female goat a year old\* for a sin offering.
- Num 15:28 And the priest shall make atonement before the Lord for the person who makes a mistake, when he sins unintentionally, to make atonement for him, and • he shall be forgiven.
- Num 15:30 But the person who does anything with a high hand, whether he is • • native or a • • sojourner, • reviles • the Lord, and • that • person shall be cut off from among his people.
- Num 15:31 Because he has despised the word of the Lord and has broken • his commandment, • that • person shall be utterly cut off; his iniquity shall be on him.”
- Num 16:38 • As for the censers of • these men who have • sinned at the cost of their lives, • let • them be made into hammered plates as a covering for the altar, for they offered them before the Lord, and they became holy. Thus they shall be • a sign to the people of Israel.”
- Num 19:11 “Whoever touches • the dead body of any person • shall be unclean seven days.
- Num 19:13 Whoever touches • a dead person, • the body • of anyone who has died, and does not cleanse himself, defiles • the tabernacle of the Lord, and • that • person shall be cut off from Israel; because the water for impurity was not thrown on him, he shall be unclean. His uncleanness is still on him.
- Num 19:18 Then a clean person shall take hyssop and dip it in the water and sprinkle it on the tent and on all the furnishings and on the persons who were there and on whoever touched • the bone, or • the slain or • the dead or • the grave.
- Num 19:20 “• If the man who is unclean • does not cleanse himself, • • that • person shall be cut off from the midst of the assembly, since he has defiled • the sanctuary of the Lord. Because the water for impurity has not been thrown on him, he is unclean.
- Num 19:22 And whatever the unclean person touches • • shall be unclean, and • anyone† who touches it shall be unclean until • evening.”
- Num 21:4 • From • Mount Hor they set out\* by the way to the Red Sea,\* to go around • the land of Edom. And the people became impatient\* on the way.

- Num 21:5 And the people spoke against God and against Moses, “Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and **we** loathe • this • worthless food.”
- Num 23:10 Who can count the dust of Jacob or number† • the fourth part of Israel? Let **me** die the death of the upright, and let my end be like his!”
- Num 29:7 “• On the tenth day of • this • seventh • month you shall have\* a holy convocation and afflict • **yourselves**. You shall do no • work,
- Num 30:2 If a man vows a vow to the Lord, or swears an oath to bind • **himself** by a pledge, he shall not break his word. He shall do according to all that proceeds out of his mouth.
- Num 30:4 and her father hears of • her vow and of her pledge by which she has bound • **herself** and • • says nothing\* to her, then all her vows shall stand, and every pledge by which she has bound • **herself** shall stand.
- Num 30:5 But if her father opposes • her on the day that he hears of it, no • vow of hers, • no pledge • by which she has bound • **herself** shall stand. And the Lord will forgive • her, because her father opposed • her.
- Num 30:6 “• If she marries a husband,\* while under her vows • • or any thoughtless utterance of her lips by which she has bound • **herself**,
- Num 30:7 and her husband hears of it and says nothing\* to her on the day that he hears, then her vows shall stand, and her pledges by which she has bound • **herself** shall stand.
- Num 30:8 But if, on the day that her husband comes to hear of it, he opposes • her, then he makes void • her vow that was on her, and • the thoughtless utterance of her lips by which she bound • **herself**. And the Lord will forgive • her.
- Num 30:9 (But any vow of a widow or of a divorced woman, anything by which she has bound • **herself**, shall stand against her.)
- Num 30:10 And if she vowed in her husband’s house or bound • **herself** by a pledge with an oath,
- Num 30:11 and her husband heard of it and said nothing\* to her and did not oppose • her, then all her vows shall stand, and every pledge by which she bound • **herself** shall stand.

- Num 30:12 But if her husband makes • them null and void on the day that he hears them, then whatever proceeds out of her lips concerning her vows or concerning her pledge of herself\* shall not stand. Her husband has made them void, and the Lord will forgive • her.
- Num 30:13 Any vow and any binding oath to afflict herself, her husband may establish, • or her husband may make • void.
- Num 31:19 • • Encamp outside the camp seven days. Whoever of you has killed any person and whoever has touched • any • slain, purify yourselves • and your captives on the • third day and on the • seventh day.
- Num 31:28 And levy for the Lord a tribute from the men of • war who went out to • battle, one • out of five hundred, of the people and of the oxen and of the donkeys and of the flocks.
- Num 31:35 and 32,000 persons in all, • • • women who had not known man by lying • with him.
- Num 31:40 • The persons\* were 16,000, of which the Lord's • tribute was 32 persons.
- Num 31:46 and 16,000 persons—
- Num 31:50 And we have brought • the Lord's offering, what each man found, articles of gold, armlets and bracelets, signet rings, earrings, and beads, to make atonement for ourselves before the Lord.”
- Num 35:11 then you shall select • • cities to be cities of refuge for you, that the manslayer who kills any person without intent\* may flee there.
- Num 35:15 • These six • cities shall be for refuge for the people of Israel, and for the stranger and for the sojourner among them, that anyone who kills any person without intent\* may • flee there.
- Num 35:30 “If anyone kills a person, • the murderer shall be put to death on the evidence of witnesses. But no person shall be put to death on the testimony of one witness. • • •
- Num 35:31 Moreover, you shall accept no ransom for the life of a murderer, who is guilty of death, but he shall be put to death.
- Deut 4:9 “Only take care,\* • and keep your soul diligently, lest you forget • the things that your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the\* days of\* your life.\* • Make\* them known\* to your children and • your children's children—
- Deut 4:15 “Therefore watch yourselves very carefully. Since you saw no • form on the day that the Lord spoke to you at Horeb out of the midst of the fire,

- Deut 4:29 But from there you will seek • the Lord your God and you will find him, if you search after\* him with all your heart and with all your **soul**.
- Deut 6:5 • You shall love • the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your **soul** and with all your might.
- Deut 10:12 “And now, Israel, what does the Lord your God require of you, but to fear • the Lord your God, to walk in all his ways, • to love • him, • to serve • the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your **soul**,
- Deut 10:22 Your fathers went down to Egypt • seventy **persons**, and now the Lord your God has made\* you as numerous as the stars of heaven.
- Deut 11:13 “And • if you will indeed obey • my commandments that I command • you today, to love • the Lord your God, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your **soul**,

- Eccles 6:3 If a man fathers a hundred children and lives many years, so that\* the days of his years are many, but his soul is not satisfied with life's good things, and he\* also has\* no burial, I say that a stillborn child\* is better off than he.
- Eccles 6:7 All the toil of man is for his mouth, yet his appetite is not satisfied.
- Eccles 6:9 Better is the sight of the eyes than the wandering of the appetite: this also is vanity and a striving after wind.

- Isa 3:20 the headdresses, • the armlets, • the sashes, • the • **perfume** boxes, and the amulets;
- Isa 5:14 Therefore Sheol has enlarged its **appetite** and opened its mouth beyond measure, and the nobility of • Jerusalem and her multitude will go down, • her revelers and he who exults in her.
- Isa 10:18 • The glory of his forest and of his fruitful land the Lord will destroy, both **soul** and • body, and it will be as when a sick man wastes away.
- Isa 15:4 • Heshbon and Elealeh cry out; their voice is heard as far as\* Jahaz; therefore the armed men of Moab cry aloud; his **soul** trembles. • •
- Isa 19:10 • • Those who are the • pillarst† of the land will be crushed, and all who work for pay will be grieved. •
- Isa 26:8 • In the path of your judgments, O Lord, we wait for you; • your name and • • remembrance are the desire of our **soul**.

- Ezek 18:4 Behold, all • souls are mine; • the soul of the father • as well as the soul of the son is mine: • the soul who sins • shall die.

- Ezek 33:9 But if you warn the wicked to turn • from his way, and he does not turn from his way, that person shall die in his iniquity, but you will have delivered your **soul**.
- Ezek 36:5 therefore thus says the • Lord God: Surely I have spoken in my hot jealousy against the rest of the nations and against all Edom, who gave • my land to themselves as a possession with wholehearted joy and **utter contempt,\*** that they might make its pasturelands • a prey.
- Ezek 47:9 And • wherever • the river goes, every living **creature** that swarms will live, and there will be very many • fish. For • this • water goes there, that the waters of the sea may become fresh; so everything will live where the river goes. •
- Hos 4:8 They feed on the sin of my people; • **they are greedy\*** for their iniquity.
